**How Should I Lead
Family Worship In My Home?**

Family worship is a necessary extension of the church's life, carrying the grace of the Lord's Day into the ordinary patterns of the week. As seen in Calvin's Company of Pastors, the pastors of Geneva understood that lasting reform depended not only on faithful preaching, but on households shaped by Scripture, prayer, and praise. The home was viewed as a primary place of formation, where parents served as the first catechists in teaching the faith, cultivating reverence, and ordering daily life according to God's Word.

At the end of this bulletin, we have provided a Family Worship Guide to help San Diego Reformed Church share in that common discipline. By working through the same hymn, catechism questions, Scripture readings, memory work, and prayers each week, our homes are tethered to the worship of the gathered church. These practices foster unity, reinforce what is taught from the pulpit, and form both children and adults in a steady, durable piety. Through simple faithfulness, God uses family worship to strengthen the church and to establish His truth in every generation.

THE BAPTIST CATECHISM

Questions 54-55

You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generation of them that hate me, and showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments."

Q. 55. What is required in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment requires the receiving, observing, and keeping pure and entire all such religious worship and ordinances, as God has appointed in His word.

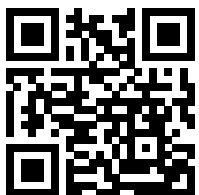
