Confession of Faith

The Athanasian Creed (Paragraphs 10-11)

Minister: Christian, what is the catholic* faith?

Congregation: But it is necessary for eternal salvation that one also believe in the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ faithfully. Now this is the true faith: That we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and human, equally.

He is God from the essence of the Father, begotten before time; and He is human from the essence of His mother, born in time; completely God, completely human, with a rational soul and human flesh; equal to the Father as regards divinity, less than the Father as regards humanity.

This is the catholic* faith: one cannot be saved without believing it firmly and faithfully

May I Come To The Lord's Table?

At San Diego Reformed Church, we commit ourselves to observe The Lord's Supper at every Lord's Day service. We are a church that cherishes the Word of God. Accordingly, our service is filled with the Word. We pray the Word, recite the Word, sing the Word, sit under the preaching of the Word, and at the height of it all, sit down to feast upon the Word.

God has already prepared the table for us. So, we warmly invite to the Lord's table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the wine with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner (spiritually poor and sick, as Calvin put it), without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for salvation. You also acknowledge to the elders of this congregation that you are in covenant with God, being active in a congregation which is covenantally bound to the triune God through Word and sacrament.
