How Should I Lead Family Worship In My Home?

Family worship is a necessary extension of the church's life, carrying the grace of the Lord's Day into the ordinary patterns of the week. As seen in Calvin's Company of

Pastors, the pastors of Geneva understood that lasting reform depended not only on faithful preaching, but on households shaped by Scripture, prayer, and praise.

The home was viewed as a primary place of formation, where parents served as the first catechists in teaching the faith, cultivating reverence, and ordering daily life according to God's Word.

At the end of this bulletin, we have provided a Family Worship Guide to help San Diego Reformed Church share in that common discipline. By working through the same hymn, catechism questions, Scripture readings, memory work, and prayers each week, our homes are tethered to the worship of the gathered church. These practices foster unity, reinforce what is taught from the pulpit, and form both children and adults in a steady, durable piety. Through simple faithfulness, God uses family worship to strengthen the church and to establish His truth in every generation.
