#### **Seeking God in the Day to Day**

*But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and these things shall be added to you.  
Matthew 6:33*

*In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths. Proverbs 3:6*

*Seek the LORD and His strength; Seek His face evermore! Psalm 105:4*

Then Samson called to the LORD, saying, “O Lord GOD, remember me, I pray! Strengthen me, I pray, just this once, O God, that I may with one blow take vengeance on the Philistines for my two eyes!” Judges 16:28

Most of us have read the scripture, “But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and these things shall be added to you.” But how can we apply this to our life? What does it mean to seek Him daily? I think He answers this for us with the verse we find in Proverbs 3:6, “In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He will direct your paths.” In “all” your ways acknowledge Him? Sometimes that feels like too big of a task, doesn’t it?

Seeking God daily to me means having a daily awareness to include God in every area of my life. Remember, the word says, “in all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths.” When you learn to acknowledge Him in everything, then you’ll be better prepared for life and more equipped to fight the battle against the enemy!
