

The Sun'll Come Out Tomorrow

How Does God Want Us to Feel While Moving Forward?

Text: [Luke 12:22-34](#)

Theme (Forward): Confidence in God's care frees us to prioritize Him

Purpose: God provides all we need when we treat Him like He's all we need

Big Idea:

- Forward is not driven by anxiety about tomorrow.
- Forward is sustained by confidence in God's care today.

When tomorrow feels uncertain, there is a temptation to mismanage today — to move in ways that feel faithful to fear instead of faithful to God.

Jesus addresses that tension directly.

Context Matters

This teaching follows Jesus' warning about the rich fool — a man who prepared for this life but neglected the next.

"One's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." (v.15)

Jesus calls that man a fool because he was rich toward himself, but poor toward God.

Now Jesus turns to His disciples — those walking closely with Him — and gives them deeper insight because this hits differently for followers.

Four Pillars from Luke 12:22-34

- 1. God's Care - Jesus reminds them who they belong to.**
 - Ravens are fed without storehouses
 - Lilies are clothed without labor
 - God knows what we need before we ask
 - If God is attentive to birds and grass, how much more attentive is He to His children?
- 2. Human Limitation - "Which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his life?"**
 - a. Anxiety is powerless.
 - i. It cannot extend life, secure provision, or create peace.
 - ii. If worry could fix it, it already would have.
- 3. Generosity - "Sell your possessions and give to the needy."**
 - a. This is not a call to irresponsibility.
 - b. It is a warning against hoarding, entitlement, and closed hands.
 - i. Not "give away your rent money"
 - ii. Not "never enjoy what you have"
 - iii. But "don't worship what God entrusted to you"
 - iv. If God gave it to you, some of it may be for someone else.
 - v. And if God calls us to generosity, He is responsible for the outcome.
- 4. Kingdom Priority - "Seek His kingdom, and these things will be added to you."**
 - a. Jesus does not say seek provision.
 - b. Provision finds those who seek the kingdom.
 - c. Forward spiritual maturity requires reordering priorities — sometimes shifting schedules, habits, and beliefs — to give God space to honor His promises.

What Moving Forward Requires

- Trust instead of control
- Patience instead of panic
- Faithfulness even while doubt is still present

This life is formative, not final. Jesus is not minimizing this life — He's placing it correctly.

- Anxiety grips tighter.
- Faith opens its hands.



Closing Truth

Everything we exhaust ourselves worrying about is God's responsibility. Everything about trusting Him, seeking Him, and following Him is ours. If we're going to move Forward, we must stop believing security comes from what we store up. Our peace is not in what we accumulate — it's in who we trust.
