I Thess 2: 17-20

- In these few verses, Paul lays out three things for us to consider
  - First.....the heartfelt love for one another (Vs 17)
  - Second....the hindrances of Satan (Vs 18)
  - Third.....Jesus is coming back again (Vs 19)
- Love for one another
  - •John 13: 34-35
    - In this passage there is an implication of something far greater than "phileo" love

- It is the desire for our brothers and sisters in Christ to have.....
  - Their spiritual needs met
    - Eph 5: 18-21
    - Why are we to do this?
    - Eph 5: 15-16
  - Their physical needs met as well
    - James 2: 15-16; I Thess 1: 8-9
  - An example of Christ lived before them (Vs 10)

- Paul says...we were deprived of those things
  - Vs 17....having been taken away from you
  - Acts 17: 1-10
    - Some have said that the pledge of Jason was that Paul would never be allowed in Thessalonica again
    - Paul is giving this church his heartfelt thoughts
      - Vs 18a....more than once I wanted to come to you
- "yet Satan hindered us"
  - We need to look at some examples of Satan's work
  - Job 1: 1

- Here was a godly man who feared God and hated evil.....
  - Lesson #1.....
  - If you are going to live for God, you have a target on your back
  - Job 1: 7-10
    - Satan hates the blessings of God in your life
  - Lesson # 2.....
    - Job 1: 12; Job 2: 6......Satan can only do what God allows
    - Why would God allow this????

- •Lesson # 3.....
  - Vs 9...... Satan will use anything or anyone to throw you off course
- •Lesson # 4.....
  - Job 4: 1-9......Satan will use lying and accusations
  - His tactics never change
  - Note.....
  - Ananias and Sapphira.....
    - Lying to whom? (Acts 5: 3-4)

- Lesson # 5......
  - The greatest and least are in his sights
  - Peter....
    - Luke 22: 31
  - Paul.....
    - II Cor 12: 7
  - Judas.....
    - Luke 22: 3; II Cor 4: 3-4
  - He is always after the Church
    - Rev 2: 9; 13; 3: 9

- Lesson # 6
  - Luke 22: 31-32
    - Strengthen your brothers
  - II Cor 1: 3-6
    - Comfort one another
- •I Thess 2: 19.....
  - Who is our hope or joy?
  - Is it not you???
- When????
  - At His coming

- Paul lived in the expectation of Christ's coming
  - "in the presence"
  - "Parousia"....used in the context of viewing the person
  - Used 18 times in the N.T.
    - II Thess 2: 8-9
      - Referring to the Anti-christ
      - Note Satan is always trying to imitate God
      - Isa 14: 14

- Regardless of how hard he tries he cannot stop the plan of God
- Jesus is coming!!!!
- Paul realizes this and takes great joy in knowing this
  - In fact, the entire N.T. is replete with verses
  - Those verses may not use the same words
    - But the concept is the same
    - Jesus is coming and nothing or no one will change that

- Examples....Given by Jesus.(Matt 13:40-43; 19:28; 24:30, 31; 25:1-12, 31-46; Mark 8:38; 13:6, 7, 24-26; 14:62; Luke 12:35-40; 18:8; 21:36)
- The writings of Paul.... (Rom 8:19-24; 1 Cor 15:22-28, 51-57; 2 Cor 5:9, 10; Eph 4:30; Phil 3:20, 21; Col 3:4; 1 Thess 4:13-17; 5:1-11; 2 Thess 1:7-10; 2:1-14; 1 Tim 6:14; 2 Tim 1:18; 4:1, 8; Titus 2:13).

- James twice mentions Jesus' return
  - James 5: 7-8
- Peter speaks of Jesus' return
  - 1 Peter (<u>1:7</u>; 4:5, <u>13</u>; 5:4-10)
  - II Peter 3....is all about Jesus' return
- •John in his gospel.....(<u>John 3:18</u>, <u>36</u>; <u>5:24</u>; <u>15:3</u>; <u>17:3</u>; <u>1 John 2:5</u>; <u>3:14</u>; <u>4:13</u>; <u>5:13</u>, <u>19</u>) (<u>John 3:19</u>; <u>5:24</u>; <u>9:39</u>; <u>12:31</u>; <u>1 John 3:14</u>). (<u>John 5:28</u>, <u>29</u>; <u>6:39</u>, <u>40</u>, <u>44</u>; <u>12:48</u>; <u>21:22</u>, <u>23</u>).

- Now none of us knows when He will return
  - Neither did any of his apostles
  - They all lived through intense times
  - Knowing that He was coming back
  - Knowing that He would not forget them
  - Knowing that when He is revealed
  - He has said we will see His face
- We will look at those we have told the good news to and say...."you are our glory and joy"
- Daniel 12: 3
