a) What is the difference between the "wise man" in this passage and those who address Jesus as "Lord, Lord" in the verses prior (vv. 21–23)?
b) How much value does Jesus place on us putting His words "into practice"?
c) Explain the difference between addressing Jesus as "Lord, Lord" and truly living as if He is "Lord"?
d) How can we know for sure what Jesus will say to each of us on the Day of Judgment?
