It existed in the OT note the Hebrew word <i>qahal</i> .  ~ The Pentateuch used this Hebrew word a little over 120 times; in pretty much every use it meant = an assembly, a company, or a group of people.  ~ The Greek septuagint recognized this gathering and used the same concept. The Greek word <i>ekklesia</i> meant a "calling out."
