

## A Working Definition of the Church ....

"A group of Christians who assemble as an earthly embassy of Christ's heavenly kingdom, to affirm one another as his citizens through the ordinances. To proclaim the good news and commands of Christ the King, to display God's own holiness & love through a unified and diverse people; as they follow the teaching and example of the pastors/elders & overseers.

## > Church History:

- In 325AD, the emperor Constantine asked roughly 300 bishops to meet together in Nicea to bring unity to the church. A man named Arius was propagating that Jesus was God in that He was greater than humans, not not equal to or like God the Father.
- The result of the meeting produced what we call the Nicene Creed.

## Defining the Term Christian:

- ~ A Christian is someone who has been truly *converted* by God, who has been saved by the *power* of God, for the display of God's own *glory & power*. (Bro. Tony)
- ~ A Christian is someone who, first and foremost, has been forgiven of his sin and been reconciled to God the Father through Jesus Christ. (Mark Dever; *What is a Healthy Church*?)

## According to the Nicene Creed, We get Four Important Words about the Church:

(Ephesians 4:4-5)
~ There is one church universally. But the universal church is best seen in the local church.

(1 Peter 2:9 & Ephesians 1:1&4)
~ The Greek word for holy (and the Greek for saints) come from the root word <i>hagios</i> which literally means holy,,
oure or blameless, and even saints.
~ A needed message for our culture today: We do not need to
make the church relevant to the culture. The culture should be conforming to the concepts, patterns, and identity of the church.
There is no biblical way to make church relevant to people who have no interest in surrendering their lives." (Michael Sherrard)
