

## The Cure for Lukewarm Faith July 2, 2023

Revelation 3:14-22

Questions for Study and Group Discussion

\*\* Before you begin, please read Revelation 3:14-22

- 1. Icebreaker: What food or drink makes you gag? (Light-hearted question!)
- 2. Icebreaker: What are you known for? List 3-5 qualities that come to mind first that describe you.
- 3. From what you read in Revelation 3:14-22, how does the church at Laodicea see themselves compared to how Jesus views them? (Refer to specific verses from the passage in your response.) What stands out about this?
- 4. What is lukewarm faith, and how does Jesus respond to it? (See esp. Revelation 3:15-17.)
- 5. Three "symptoms of self-sufficiency" were mentioned in the sermon, and are listed below. Briefly summarize what each one means, and how it can indicate a reliance on self (to the exclusion of relying on God).
  - Individualism
  - Workaholism
  - Prayerlessness
- 6. Are there other symptoms of self-sufficiency you would add? What else would you list?
- 7. Practically speaking, how can you remind yourself of your ongoing need for Jesus and depend on Him?
- 8. Read Revelation 3:18-22 again. What do you learn here about what faith in Jesus offers?
- 9. Still focusing on Revelation 3:18-22, what does faith in Jesus require of us? In other words, how do we receive Jesus' offer?
- 10. What other questions or comments do you have about this passage that haven't yet come up and that you'd like to discuss?
- 11. What is your biggest take-away from what you've discussed so far? What practical step will you take to apply what you've seen in God's Word?
- 12. This sermon concluded Brookside's 7-part series on Revelation 2-3 ("What Jesus Says to the Church"). Briefly review what you've learned and key take-aways. Have everyone share "one big thing" they're leaving with from this series.
- 13. Are there ways this series has taken root in your life? How are you different today than you were 9 weeks ago, because of the truth in Revelation 2-3?
- 14. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
