

Humility Discussion Guide | May 31, 2020 Before you begin, please read Philippians 2:3-11

- 1. In your own experience, is the character trait of humility viewed more positively or negatively? Why?
- 2. One definition of humility says this: "Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it's thinking of yourself less." Explain what this means, in your own words. What's especially helpful for you, from this definition?
- 3. Imagine a world where humility didn't exist. What would relationships in that world look like?
- 4. In Philippians 2:3-4, Paul unpacks what it looks like to be humble. Using language straight from these two verses, make a list of all the ways Paul helps us understand what humility looks like.
- 5. Look at the list you created in the previous question. How do these things help relationships thrive?
- 6. What are practical ideas for how you can show humility in your relationships this week?
- 7. From Philippians 2:5-11, how is Jesus THE example of true humility?
- 8. Jesus isn't only our *example* of humility. Because of the gospel, Jesus changes our hearts so we can truly be humble He *empowers* our own humility. Why is rooting our own humility in the gospel (what Jesus did for us on the cross, and the new life that offers) so essential?
- 9. Read the following passages from the Bible. How do they add to or reinforce what you've learned about humility so far?
 - Psalm 25:9
 - Proverbs 18:12
 - Isaiah 66:2
 - Mark 10:43-45
 - James 4:13-18
 - 1 Peter 5:5-6
- 10. Challenge Memorize Philippians 2:3-4: 3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.
