



Promised Plan June 2, 2024 | Ruth 4:13-22 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

** Before you begin, please read Ruth 4:13-22

- 1. Briefly recap what has happened in the story of Ruth so far (chapters 1-4:12). What biblical themes do you see in this story?
- 2. How did God redeem Ruth's past? What about Ruth makes her a surprising recipient of God's grace?
- 3. How did God redeem Naomi's pain? (Compare the women and Naomi's responses to the birth of Obed in vs. 14-17 with Naomi's reaction to the death of her husband and sons in Ruth 1:15, 20-21.)
- 4. Read Psalm 127:3-5. Why was the birth of Obed such a precious gift? How did his birth demonstrate God's grace?
- 5. Why do you think the story of Ruth concludes with a genealogy of David?
- 6. Read Matthew 1:5-6. Ruth was one of only five women Matthew named in Jesus' genealogy. Why is this significant?
- 7. Where have you seen God faithfully at work in your life in the past? How is your story like Ruth's story of destiny?
- 8. Where do you need to trust God's faithfulness right now?
- 9. Faithfulness might not come with ease, but it does come with promises. What are some practical ways to remember God's promises when persevering in faith is difficult?
- 10. What is your biggest take-away from the book of Ruth? What practical steps will you take to apply what you've seen in this book?
- 11. Who do you know that needs to be reminded that God is in control and has a purpose for their lives? How might you encourage them to trust Christ in the midst of their difficulties this week?
- 12. **Challenge:** Memorize Ruth 4:14: "The women said to Naomi: "Praise be to the LORD, who this day has not left you without a guardian-redeemer. May he become famous throughout Israel!" (NIV)
