

Resolve June 9, 2024 | Daniel 1:1-21 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

** Before you begin, please read Daniel 1:1-21

- 1. Icebreaker: Share a "cross-cultural experience" you've had. This could be a trip overseas or any experience where you were around different customs, languages, or ways of doing things.
- 2. From Daniel 1:1-7, make a list of reasons that Daniel and his friends would have felt pressure to assimilate into Babylonian culture.
- 3. How can living faithfully for Jesus in our world today be difficult?
- 4. Why is it important for followers of Jesus to live faithfully for Jesus in our world today?
- 5. How do you see Daniel and his friends living faithfully in Daniel 1:8-14?
- 6. What are areas of life in which followers of Jesus should live distinctly from the culture around us today?
- 7. Summarize how Daniel approaches the court official with his resolved decision (Daniel 1:8-14). What stands out to you about Daniel's approach?
- 8. What examples of "triumph over exile" do you see in Daniel 1? (That is, how does Daniel's faithfulness make a difference? Where do you see God at work in this story?)
- 9. Three takeaways were mentioned at the end of the message and are listed below. For each one, briefly summarize what it means and a practical way you can apply this take-away in your life.
 - Remember your identity.
 - Resolve to live faithfully.
 - Hope in the triumph that Jesus wins.
- 10. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible today?
- 11. What is your biggest takeaway from what you've discussed so far? What practical steps will you take to apply what you've seen in God's Word?
- 12. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
- 13. **Challenge: Memorize Hebrews 13:14** "For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come."
