

A Greater Compassion 1 Peter 4:1-11 February 12, 2023 Questions for Study and Group Discussion ** Before you begin, please read 1 Peter 4:1-11

- 1. Icebreaker: What are you doing / did you do for the Superbowl? Were you rooting for a particular team? Any favorite commercials that you remember?
- 2. How does 1 Peter 4:1-11 instill a sense of urgency in how we live our lives? (Hint: look especially at the commands Peter gives in verses 1 and 7, and at the various ways he brings up the end of time.)
- 3. As you consider your own life and look at the culture around us, do you see more apathy in how we live, or more urgency? Why?
- 4. Below you'll see the four main points that were made in the sermon what 1 Peter 4:1-11 says about practical ways we can live with a right urgency now. Walk through these points one-by-one, (1) briefly summarizing what Peter says, and (2) sharing take-aways that stand out to you.
 - Pursue holiness more than selfish pleasure and ease. (1 Peter 4:1-6)
 - Resolve to stay focused on God. (1 Peter 4:7)
 - Love others earnestly, even when it's hard. (1 Peter 4:8-9)
 - Practice ways to use your gifts to serve others. (1 Peter 4:10-11)
- 5. Why is it important to root our motivation for this "urgency living" in the good news of the gospel?
- 6. What other questions do you have about this passage that haven't yet come up and that you'd like to discuss?
- 7. What is your biggest take-away from what you've discussed so far? Why did this stand out to you the way it did?
- 8. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
- 9. Challenge: Memorize 1 Peter 4:7-8: 7 The end of all things is near. Therefore be alert and of sober mind so that you may pray. 8 Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude
