

The Lord is My Shepherd January 14, 2024 | Psalm 23:1 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

** Before you begin, please read Psalm 23:1-6. (These questions will focus on Psalm 23:1.)

- 1. Icebreaker: Psalm 23 is a familiar passage to many. Explain any exposure you've had to this psalm and/or how it's played a role in your life.
- 2. How does the culture around us feed consumerism and competition more than contentment?
- 3. Why is contentment an important virtue to value? (Dig in more deeply and check out 1 Timothy 6:6-10; Philippians 4:11-13; Matthew 6:25-34.)
- 4. What does David root his contentment ("I lack nothing") in, according to Psalm 23:1? What stands out to you about this?
- 5. Spend some time focusing on the individual words in the statement, "The LORD is my shepherd," and create a list of at least 4-6 observations or take-aways.
- 6. Read John 10:11. How do Jesus's words add to your understanding of what you've read in Psalm 23:1?
- 7. How have you experienced the shepherding nature of God in your life?
- 8. Psalm 23:1 is a declaration of trust in God. What is one area of your life where you need to trust in the shepherding nature and work of God?
- 9. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible?
- 10. What is your biggest take-away from what you've discussed so far? What practical step will you take to apply what you've seen in God's Word?
- 11. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
- 12. Challenge: Memorize Psalm 23:1: "The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing."
