

Confidence in God's Presence December 10, 2023 | Matthew 1:18-25 and Isaiah 7:1-17 Questions for Study and Group Discussion

**Before discussing these questions, read through Matthew 1:18-25 and Isaiah 7:1-17 as a group.

- 1. Icebreaker: Describe a time when the presence of a particular person in an experience made a significant difference (maybe an all-star athlete on a team you were on, a friend providing comfort at a pivotal time, an expert who supported you at work, etc.).
- 2. What does Matthew 1:22-23 say about Jesus's identity? What stands out to you about this?
- 3. Why is it significant that Jesus fulfills prophecy? What does this say about both (1) the divine inspiration of the Bible, and (2) who Jesus is?
- 4. What is the threat the nation of Judah is facing in Isaiah 7:1-17? (See esp. vv. 1-2.)
- 5. How does King Ahaz respond? (See esp. vv. 2-3; also 2 Kings 16:5-9.)
- 6. How does the Lord invite Ahaz to respond? (See vv. 4, 9-10.)
- 7. Read Isaiah 7;14 out loud. How should this promise motivate confidence in God's plan for God's people?
- 8. Reflect on all you've discussed from Isaiah 7. How does this passage encourage faith in God (as opposed to anything else)?
- 9. What practical step can you take this week, to demonstrate faith in (reliance, trust) the Sovereign Lord?
- 10. How can the significance of Jesus as "God with us" shape the way you approach Christmas this year? How should these truths guide your thoughts? Actions? Emotions?
- 11. What other questions or comments do you have about what you've looked at in the Bible?
- 12. What is your biggest take-away from what you've discussed so far? What practical step will you take to apply what you've seen in God's Word?
- 13. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
- 14. **Challenge: Memorize Matthew 1:23:** 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' (which means 'God with us').
