

## A Greater Mindset 1 Peter 5:1-14

February 26, 2023 Questions for Study and Group Discussion \*\* Before you begin, please read 1 Peter 5:1-14

- 1. Icebreaker: Imagine you were interviewing someone for a job. Is attitude or skill-set more important to you? Why?
- 2. From 1 Peter 5:1-4, make a list of all the attitudes (or character traits) that should characterize leaders in the church. Does anything stand out to you about what Peter emphasizes?
- 3. Why is strong, godly character important in leadership?
- 4. In 1 Peter 5:5-7, Peter emphasizes humility. What reasons does he provide for why we should value (and demonstrate!) humility so deeply?
- 5. What is one tangible step you can take this week that demonstrates humility?
- 6. In 1 Peter 5:8-9 Peter drives us to vigilance as we follow Jesus. Why does the reality of our enemy the devil demand vigilance?
- 7. Read 1 Peter 5:10-11 out loud as a group. What truths about God do these verses highlight?
- 8. How can 1 Peter 5:10-11 instill hope in your life this week? Explain your response.
- 9. This sermon concluded Brookside's 9-part series on 1 Peter. Briefly review what you've learned and key take-aways. Have everyone share "one big thing" they're leaving with from this series in 1 Peter.
- 10. Are there ways this series has taken root in your life? How are you different today than you were 9 weeks ago, because of the truth in 1 Peter?
- 11. What other questions or comments do you have about this passage that haven't yet come up and that you'd like to discuss?
- 12. What is your biggest take-away from what you've discussed so far? Why did this stand out to you the way it did?
- 13. **Challenge:** Identify one way this passage is challenging or encouraging you. Who can you tell about what you're learning this coming week?
- 14. **Challenge: Memorize 1 Peter 5:10-11:** 10 And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. 11 To him be the power for ever and ever. Amen.
