

## Our Commitment to Jesus' Mission

Discussion Guide | May 3, 2020 Before you begin, please read Matthew 28:18-20

- 1. Share a time when you were asked to do (and you did) something that was way bigger than what you felt prepared to do. What lessons did you learn?
- 2. What is Jesus telling His disciples to do in Matthew 28:18-20? In what ways might this have seemed way bigger than what they felt prepared to do?
- 3. What does it mean to make disciples? What does a disciple "look like"? What other Scripture passages can help provide definition to this?
- 4. "Everyone is a disciple of something." Summarize what this statement means in your own words. Why is it important to reflect on who / what you're following and devoted to in life?
- 5. Describe someone you know who you'd identify as a disciple-maker. What about them makes you say this?
- 6. How can you be a disciple-maker, in any of your current relationships, and in the place you're living now? (You don't need to move overseas to apply this passage!) What small steps can you take to obey Jesus' command?
- 7. What does Jesus promise in Matthew 28:20? How does this give you confidence in walking forward into Jesus' mission?
- 8. What does Jesus claim in Matthew 28:18? How does this give you courage in walking forward into Jesus' mission?
- 9. The title of this current series is "What Hasn't Changed?" What's one way you would answer this question, based on what you've learned from Matthew 28:18-20? What practical difference can this make in your life this coming week?
- 10. Quickly review big take-aways from any or all of the three sermons in this series (listed below). Why is it so important to keep these things that haven't changed in place? How can you do that in the days and weeks ahead?
