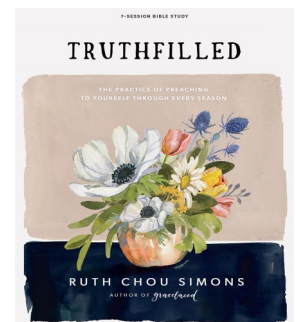



Pastor's Column

- **Big Thank You!** For all the support, attendance, help, flowers, communion supplies, and all the special effort by ushers, musicians and volunteers to make for a very special Holy Week and Easter is very much appreciated! Worship is the work of the people, and our people have been working hard indeed this year!
- **Communion** today will be offered in two forms. If you wish to pick up the prepackaged cups as we have been doing and take it back to your pew, you can do so. If you are comfortable coming to kneel or stand at the altar railing to receive bread and dip it into the cup, you can do so. If you want to pick up a prepackaged cup and receive communion around the railing, you can do that as well!
- **I will be out of town end of April-end of May:** Beginning April 25, I'll be going to Philmont Scout Reservation with other United Methodist scouters April 27-May 1, where we'll repair the Protestant Chapels. Following that excursion, I will be touring Pure Water ministries with Pastor Becky, Judy, and Carol to meet the Navajo's who are coming for VBS and to scout out future mission opportunities we can take on together, perhaps sending a team next year to their area. A retreat/mini sabbatical/2 and ½ days of "Creating a Culture of Renewal" classes will take me to Caedmon's graduation on May 20, and we will have family time to May 26. While I am away, Pastor Tommy will be coordinating pastoral care and other needs with help of our Lay Leaders, Tom Hite and Pauline Snider, along with Pastor Becky. We have excellent preachers lined up: Tom Hite, Youth Sunday (May 8, Mother's Day – single service at 10am), Mark Biondolillo, and Pastor Becky. I will be in and out of cell and wifi service areas throughout the time I will be away, so please be aware that I may not be able to respond to emails, calls, and texts for good portions of the trip.
- **Graduates:** This year we will again be recognizing Graduation Sunday (on June 19). Two of our graduates will be finishing their bachelor's degrees long before June.
