

Basic Info:

- "DISAFFILIATION" means to disassociate
 - to stop affiliation, in this case with the UMC
- Paragraph 2553 BOD only option to allow for disaffiliation while retaining property

History

- •All current policies regarding LGBTQ+ date from 1972 BoD.
- ·2016 was supposed to resolve it...
- ·2019 was supposed to resolve it...
- •2024 may or may not resolve it

Paragraph 2553 - only option

 Applies <u>only</u> to issues of human sexuality, particularly concerning clergy and weddings

Time frame and process

- Would have to be complete in time for Annual Conference Oct 2023
- Church Council has to invite DS to start process
 - DS calls for period of discernment and gives rules for it (minimum 30 days)
 - (Not clear): Initial church conference, followed by final church conference
 - Vote has to be over 2/3rds of members present (66.7%)
 - If all done correctly, fee paid to Conference following Conference approval

Things to note

- Current UMC policy not different than GMC policy
- 2024 General Conference may or may not change policy
- No change likely in either case in how LGBTQ+ people are accepted into life of congregation

Current positions (UMC)

- UM BoD 304.3: "self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church."
- Weddings: UM Pastors may not conduct ceremonies that celebrate samesex weddings or unions. Such ceremonies also may not be held on church property.
- UMC.org "What is the church's position on homosexuality" "Based on what is known about the delegations to the next General Conference, however, even given attrition in some because of disaffiliations, it still seems unlikely that the current policies regarding human sexuality will be substantially altered."

Note:

- •In addition to outright costs, disaffiliation would also incur:
 - · Signage, 501(c)3 status, stationary, etc.
 - Use of cross and flame
 - Hymnals, etc.
 - Separate vote on where to go GMC, nondenominational, Wesleyan, etc.

More things to note

Arkansas conference has noted that churches that had over 90% in favor of disaffiliation tended to do well following disaffiliation. If the church conference falls under that percentage, they caution against disaffiliation

Final thing to note

•Churches and pastors are interdependent actors- they influence each other, but do not have to make the same choices
