

September 27, 2020 Exodus 16:1-15 "Back to 'Safety,' or Forward to the Future?"

Some Background on Our Series: We have begun a thematic Bible series, entitled, "Going Forward, Together." The idea is this beginning with the expulsion of Adam and Eve from the Garden of Eden, God closes the door on the past and opens the door for a future, a resurrection instead of continuous life, a new hope instead of the old life, and so on. If you're interested in doing your own research as we go along, the passages will be in this order: Genesis 3:20-24, Genesis 11:31-12:5, Exodus 16:1-15, Isaiah 55:1-13, Galatians 3:1-14, and Hebrews 11:13-16, 32-40, and 12:1-13. NEW: EARLY IN-PERSON VOTING OPTION Sept 18 – Oct 31, 2020

Beginning Friday, September 18, & ending Saturday, October 31, 2020, registered voters in Hampton can VOTE IN PERSON at one of two locations.

VOTING IN PERSON - Early voting (absentee voting in person)

Who can vote early: Any registered Virginia voter can vote <u>absentee</u> or <u>early</u>; you do not need to choose a reason.

Where: You can vote in person at the Registrar's main office or satellite office. You must bring an ID with you, just as you would at your precinct.

When: Begins Sept. 18; Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
