# Registered voters in Hampton can VOTE IN PERSON at one of two locations.

## VOTING IN PERSON - Early voting (absentee voting in person)

Who can vote early: Any registered Virginia voter can vote <u>absentee</u> or <u>early</u>; you do not need to choose a reason.

**Where:** You can vote in person at the Registrar's main office or satellite office. You must bring an ID with you, just as you would at your precinct.

When: Begins Sept. 18; Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
