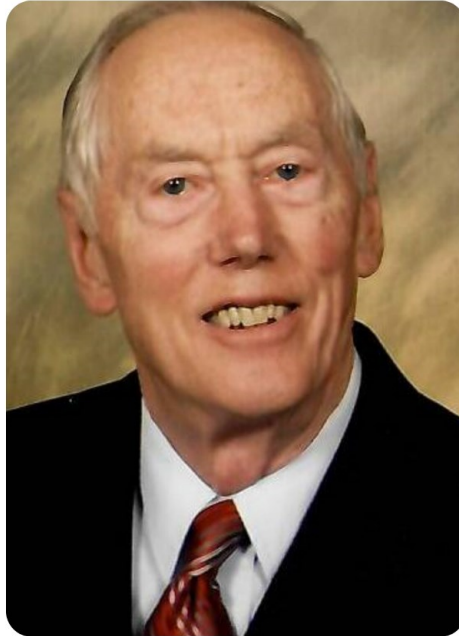

Richard G Haight died peacefully on October 31, 2025. He was born, April 6, 1927, to George and Anna Haight, a native of Barrington, New York. Dick received his Bachelor's degree from Clarkson University in Potsdam, New York. He and his first wife Aileen were childhood friends and high school sweethearts.

After Dick got out of the army and college they married on January 5, 1952. Dick's job as a civil engineer took them to Pease AFB in New Hampshire and in 1962 to Langley AFB in Hampton, Virginia. During their 61 years together, they raised four children and traveled throughout the United States and Europe. He enjoyed skiing and teaching his grandchildren how to ski. After the death of Aileen in 2013, he moved into the Chesapeake Retirement Community where he met his second wife, Julie Compton. They were married on February 24, 2018.
