The Woman at the Well - John 4: 6-42

What do we know about this woman from the Bible?

- 1. She was a Samaritan.
- 2. She recognized the social oddity of Jesus interacting with her at all. (v.9)
- 3. The woman did not have a good reputation. (v.16-18)
- 4. When she realized who Jesus claimed to be, she immediately left to tell the town about Him. (v. 28-30,39)
- 5. As a result of her belief in Jesus, many others believed as well. (v. 39-42)

What can we speculate about her?

- 1. She may not have been well liked by her own people because of her lifestyle.
- 2. She seemed to be looking for answers to life because she wanted the "water" Jesus offered. (v. 13-15)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why do you think the woman lied to Jesus when He asked about her husband?
- 2. If this woman had a questionable reputation in town, why do you think the town people listened to her?
- 3. We talked about a Samaritan leper who had heard of and been healed by Jesus. How far reaching could the woman at the well's testimony have been?

What Lessons can we learn?

- 1. The woman was willing to learn. When she realized who Jesus was, she did something with it! (James 1:22)
- 2. The woman was not ashamed to share Jesus with anyone (Matthew 28:19-20)
- 3. Why is it sometimes hard for us to talk about Jesus with people we know already?
