Review:

Two major parts of God's will: hidden and revealed will

1. God's Will Is Personal (Psalm 32:8)

- a. "Instruct" = to make one learn and understand
- b. "Teach" = to point and shoot in a definite course
- c. "Council" = to give advice for a purpose, to be a consultant
- d. What difference should it make in our daily lives to understand that God has a personal plan for us?

2. God's Will Is Definite and Specific

- a. Isaiah 30:21
- b. Ephesians 2:10
 - We were created for a specific purpose.
 - How does Psalm 139:14 connect with the truth of Eph. 2:10?

3. God's Will Is Always Good

- a. How does Joshua 1:8 describe God's plan?
- b. What does Romans 12:2 call God's will?

Talking Points:

1. How does understanding that God's will for you is personal, specific, and good change your perspective on following His will?
2. When we feel that restless, uncertain feeling while we are "looking" for God's will, how can these facts help us better trust Him?
