1. How does Society view you?

- What standards are used by our society to determine a person's worth and identity?

2. How does God view you?

- A. You are specifically and intentionally made Psalm 139
 - vv. 1-6 What does God know about you?
 - vv. 7-12 Where can you go that God will not go with you?
 - vv. 13-16 Descriptions of our design
 - + fearfully (to stand in awe of) and wonderfully (to be distinct, marked out, be separated, be distinguished) made
 - + intricately (very detailed in design) woven
 - + All of our days were planned before we were born

B. You are loved by God

- John 3:16, Ephesians 2:4-5 –God's love was demonstrated by great sacrifice
- Romans 8:38-39 God's love for us is so powerful that nothing can separate us from it

3. IF you have accepted the gift of salvation and have a relationship with God...

A You are part of God's Family

- Galatians 4:4-7
- Romans 8:15-17

B. You have purpose

- Jeremiah 29:11 God's purpose for my life is for my good
- Philippians 1:6 He will complete His plan for my life

3. The Challenge:

- After seeing God's view of who I am in contrast to the shallow expectations of society, how should this change **my** perspective?



- How should a proper view of who I am affect how I follow Christ? 1 Corinthians 5:14-15 "For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; 15 and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised."
