The Boy and His Lunch - John 6:1-13 (Matthew 14:13-21, Mark 6:30-44; Luke 9:10-17)

What do we know about this boy from the Bible?

- 1. The boy was young. ("Lad" = little boy) (v.9)
- 2. The boy must have been in front of the crowd interested? curious?
- 3. The boy came prepared with a meal for himself. (v.9)

What can we speculate about this boy?

- 1. The boy was listening to Jesus and the disciples' conversation about feeding the crowd.
- 2. The boy was willing to share what he had, believing that Jesus might be able to somehow use it.

Questions for discussion:

- 1. Why were there not more people offering their food in a collaborative effort to feed people?
- 2. What did the boy's parents think of what their son did?
- 3. Why did Jesus "test" Philip? What lesson did He want His disciples to learn?
- 4. What was significant about the number of leftovers?

What lessons can we learn?

- 1. The boy was willing to give what he had, believing that Jesus could use it. What do we have to offer God? He wants availability more than ability!
- 2. Matthew 6:31-33 God promises to provide for our needs as we follow Him.
