## James 2:14-26 – Faith without works is dead?

\*\*\* Salvation is by faith, and works has nothing to do with accepting God's gift of salvation!

- Ephesians 2:8-9, Galatians 2:16, Titus 3:5

## 1. So what is James talking about when he states, "So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead – vv.17-20, 26? (3 illustrations)

a. Caring for the poor and hungry – vv.15-16

- To tell a cold, hungry person to "Go in peace, be warmed, and filled" is worthless.

- To truly show compassion, one must act on those words, actually DO something to help people.

b. Abraham's obedience to sacrifice Isaac (Genesis 22:1-19) - vv. 21-24

- What would it have meant if Abraham to had not taken Isaac to the mountain to sacrifice him?

- Abraham demonstrated his faith to the point that he believed God would raise Isaac from the dead! (Hebrews 11:19)

c. Rahab in Jericho (Joshua 2:1-21) – v.25

- She had heard about the miracles God had performed for Israel and believed in Him.

- When faced with a choice of staying true to her native city and people or following God, she chose God.

- Her action to protect the spies and remain in the doomed city during the attack confirmed that her faith was real.

## 2. How does James' statement fit with the rest of the Bible (salvation by faith without works)?

a. If we say we have faith in God and nothing in our life shows that faith, the question should be, "How real is our faith?"

b. The Bible is clear that a true faith in God WILL produce fruit in our lives.

- Ephesians 2:10, Galatians 5:22-23, John 15:5, Matthew 5:16

## **Thoughts to Ponder**

1. How "alive" is your faith? Has God changed your life since you were saved?

2. Is your faith driving you to produce action for God? (2 Corinthians 5:14)

3. True faith in God = Works for Him, Worthless faith (faked or uncertain faith) = No works
