### **HIStory: Seeing God's Plan in the Bible**

## Creation $\rightarrow$ Sin $\rightarrow$ Flood $\rightarrow$ Promise $\rightarrow$ Christ $\rightarrow$ Eternity




- God created all things. He designed humans differently for His purpose.
- Sin is falling short of God's standard ultimately resulting in death (spiritual and physical)

#### A. The first glimmer of hope - Satan's demise foretold - Genesis 3:15

- God speaks to the snake (Satan)
  - \* Total defeat of Satan
    - + Heal crushing is not a lethal injury.
    - + Head crushing is a lethal wound ("bruise" = to bruise, crush).
- God covered Adam and Eve's shame with animal skins. Genesis 3:21

#### B. The Flood – judgement on sin and salvation for the future – Genesis 6-8

- The flood is estimated to have occurred about 1,600 years after Adam and Eve.
- Why did God judge the earth? Genesis 6:5,11-12
- Why did God choose to judge the earth for its wickedness (sin)? Genesis 6:17
- Who was the exception to God's judgement and why? Genesis 6:8-18

- Ark dimensions Genesis 6:14-16
  - \* 450ft. high x 75 ft. wide x 45 ft. high
  - \* 1.4 million cubic ft. = 522 standard railroad stock cars
- Flood facts
  - \* Extent of the flood Genesis 7:17-23
  - \* Time the water covered the earth Genesis 7:24
  - \* Noah's total time inside the ark 370 days Genesis 7-8

**About God**: God is just and gracious.

- God had to judge the evil on earth, but He also made a way to preserve His creation.
- God doesn't just judge sin but makes a way of escape from the judgement for those who believe Him and accept His offer of forgiveness for their sin.

**Big Picture**: As a result of sin, God showed His judgement.

- God showed that He had a plan for the future (snake's head will be crushed), preserving mankind through His judgment of sin (the flood).

**Application:** We see God staying true to His nature of holiness and justice, while offering grace (giving us what we don't deserve).
