## :: Summary

One of the greatest challenges of faith is living in the flow of God's grace - not only declaring that we are *saved by grace once and forever*, but also *living in grace each and every day*. After being saved by grace we fall back into a life marked by legalism and attempts at self-justification – we think it is up to us to maintain a right standing before God by our works. The Bible says otherwise. Grace not only delivers you once for all, grace sustains you day by day. All attempts at showing God you are good enough and worthy enough are pointless. Instead of proving yourself, the Scripture encourages you to deeply experience grace by living your true identity as a beloved child of God.

## :: Questions to help you experience grace upon grace:

- Do I recognize grace as an ongoing flow in my life?
- Am I learning to rely on God's all sufficient grace for my daily living and does that grace change how I approach relationships, challenging situations and difficult problems?
- Am I allowing grace to free me from imposing legalistic demands on myself and others?
- Am I utilizing the grace I keep receiving as the reservoir from which I can extend grace to others?



• Am I experiencing greater joy, gratitude, and peace because of my increasing awareness of the gift of grace in my life?
