## :: Explore and Discuss | Genesis 1:26-28, 1 Peter 2:9 and Notes

Interpreting the word "image" used in Genesis 1:26-27 according to the ancient Near Eastern context means a proxy; a royal ambassador or representative bearing resemblance to God, what is the responsibility of every person made in God's image?

In Genesis 1:28, God's command to rule and subdue the world is given in the context of the garden of Eden, a command to ongoing care of what has been entrusted to humanity. Name the implications for how we relate to the world and the people in it.

1 Peter 2:9 teaches that *every* follower of Jesus is a member of a royal priesthood, who shares in his ministry work of reconciliation. What does that mean in daily life?

## :: Apply it to Your Life

As you consider the places and people God has placed around you, what does your environment reveal about your influence? Has your influence cultivated a lush garden, produced a dirt patch full of dried sticks and weeds, or something in between?

How does influencing others as part of a "royal priesthood" in Jesus feel exciting and daunting? How do you need God's help in participating in Jesus' ministry work?

## :: Pray

Father, help me take ownership of the measure of influence you have given me, that I might use it for your glory and according to your good plans for the world. Would you show me how to do that, and help me recognize everyday opportunities to influence those you have strategically placed around me.
