:: Apply it to Your Life

When you hear the call to live a life worthy of the Lord, does it feel like a burden or impossible task, or does it simply fill you with a desire to please the One who loves you?

What does this mean to you: *"Jesus gave his all for me – I owe my all to him"*?

In verses 9-12, identify one aspect of Paul's prayer that you desire God to work more into your life (greater knowledge or wisdom, greater awareness of the Spirit moving, increased gratitude or joy, etc.)
