

#### NO 5 WE HAVE FOUND THE MESSIAH

MATTHEW 4:18-22 JOHN 1:35-51

We find Andrew being called to a new vocation to become Jesus' disciple. After meeting Jesus, Andrew was anxious to share this great news with his brother Peter, and also brought him to Jesus.

When Jesus called Andrew and Peter to not just fish, but to fish for the souls of men and for the Kingdom of God, no doubt they did not know what this challenge involved—hours of instruction, constant traveling—but they seemed not to hesitate and immediately followed Jesus.

I wonder how I would have taken on the challenge in that day. As a Christian, when we do take on the challenge to follow Christ in obedience and share the gospel, the reward is seeing God's love fill their hearts.

When we introduce someone to Jesus, as we have seen Andrew do, we don't always see the outcome, but it's God who wins them to Himself. It's our responsibility to tell others of His love for them.

I had an "Andrew" in my life, who approached me as a teenager and asked me if I had Jesus in my heart and knew that I had a home in heaven. As a teenager, I just thought that I certainly had Jesus in my heart, but I guess I didn't sound really sure. My "Andrew" said, "I will make you an appointment to meet with the pastor" who would tell me about Jesus—just like Andrew and Philip took Greeks to see Jesus.

I kept that appointment and then understood that Jesus loved me, and I could live for Him. I asked Jesus into my heart, and over the years, I have kept growing in His Word and learning how to share my faith with others.

The Bible's Andrew was a good learner, listener, and a witness for others as he sat under Jesus' teachings. These are characteristics that should be found in us.

We learn by reading God's Word, asking sharp, incisive questions that help us know the difference between understanding and confusion.

Our goal is to share our testimony. "We have found the Messiah," as Andrew said to Peter, and brought him to the Lord.


Answer the following questions each week and share in your group time that you may encourage one another!

# CROSSWORD PUZZLE


