KEY TAKEAWAYS

- We are all called to make disciples, following Jesus' command in Matthew 28:19-20.
 - True discipleship requires denying ourselves and being willing to give up everything for Christ.
 - Bold faith, like Paul's, is only possible through the power of Jesus.
 - Prayer, study of God's Word, and worship are essential for developing bold faith.
 - Our relationship with Jesus is the foundation for discipleship and sharing His message.
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DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. The sermon mentions that Paul faced death threats for his faith. What's the most significant thing you've risked or given up for your faith?
 2. How do you respond when you feel prompted by the Holy Spirit to step out of your comfort zone? What holds you back?
 3. The early Christians prayed for boldness in the face of persecution. How can we cultivate that kind of courage in our current context?
 4. Paul continued to study Scripture even while in prison. How consistent are you in studying God's Word? What benefits have you experienced from regular Bible study?
 5. The sermon emphasizes that prayer, study, and worship should flow from a passion for Jesus, not be a checklist. How can we ensure our spiritual disciplines are relationship-driven rather than duty-driven?
 6. What does "bold discipleship" look like in your daily life? In what areas do you feel challenged to be bolder in your faith?
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PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

Commit to a daily prayer time this week, specifically asking God to increase your boldness in sharing your faith.

Identify one person in your life who doesn't know Jesus. Pray for an opportunity to share your faith with them and be ready to act on it.

Practice "worshipful living" by intentionally offering your daily activities as acts of worship to God.

Share with the group next week about any moments where you stepped out in bold faith, no matter how small they might seem.
