## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Have you ever felt compelled by God to do something that seemed foolish or confusing to others? Share your experience.
  2. How do you discern between God's voice and your own desires when making important decisions?
  3. Discuss a time when you had to choose between following God's call and meeting others' expectations. How did you handle it?
  4. The sermon talks about being "ready" to face the outcomes of obedience. What does being "ready" look like in practical terms?
  5. How can we support fellow believers who are making decisions we don't fully understand or agree with?
  6. Reflect on the example of Paul's friends praying with him before parting. How can we incorporate more prayer into our daily interactions with others?

## PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS
