

# ENTICEMENT & WISDOM'S CALL

A literal second thought? A pause before answering or acting makes room to hear and heed wisdom's call.

#### INTERPRETATION

Proverbs uses four words throughout the book: learning, knowledge, wisdom, and understanding. In English, they mean nearly the same thing, but in Hebrew they have four separate, distinct meanings.

**Learning** is the word *leqah* and it means *instruction or teaching*. Learning is information used at the moment, but when that moment passes, it is forgotten or unimportant.

Any information needed for later use or on a long-term basis is **knowledge** and it is the word *da'at*. Its Hebrew meaning is *perception or skill*; the facts and ideas will be used often or daily.

**Wisdom** is *information that leads to action*. It is actually *the ability to act based on knowledge*. Emphasis is on the ABILITY. We don't always choose God's way. The word for **wisdom** is *hakmot*.

Finally, the word **understanding** is *not only knowledge* but is also *the ability to pass on that knowledge*. You not only have to learn but hold onto that knowledge and use it so that you can then give it to others. The word in Hebrew is *bîn*. It is to *perceive, discern, know (with the mind) give heed to, distinguish, consider, and have insight.* 

Solomon, himself, had the gift of great wisdom that he passed to his sons. He unfortunately did not always walk in his gift. Fourteen scriptures in the Old and New Testament talk specifically about the wisdom of Solomon. 2 Chronicles 9:23 "And all the kings of the earth sought the presence of Solomon to hear his **wisdom**, **which God had put in his heart.**"

We too, if we are in Christ and have submitted our ways and will to Him, have been given great wisdom. The decision to answer wisdom's call daily is within our ability. If we choose folly, we are often left to live with our own consequences. It is never too late to turn and choose wisdom once again. In our passage this week, Proverbs 1:23 says, "**Turn at my rebuke**; Surely I will pour out my spirit on you; I will make my Words known to you."

And when we choose wisdom then we can be assured of God's grace and mercy!

2 Chronicles 30:9 says, "...for the LORD your God is gracious and merciful, and will not **turn** His face from you **if you** return to Him."

Turn back, Sweet Ladies, and see what God will do. His wisdom is available to all who ask.
