### **Colossians 1:15-21 NKJV**

<sup>15</sup> He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.

<sup>16</sup> For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him.

<sup>17</sup> And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist.

<sup>18</sup> And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence.

<sup>19</sup> For it pleased *the Father* that in Him all the fullness should dwell,

<sup>20</sup> and by Him to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross.

<sup>21</sup> And you, who once were alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now He has reconciled  
Scriptures that declare Jesus is God...

### **John 1:1 NKJV**

<sup>1</sup> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

**John 1:14 NKJV**

<sup>14</sup> And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

**Mark 3:11 NKJV**

<sup>11</sup> And the unclean spirits, whenever they saw Him, fell down before Him and cried out, saying, “You are the Son of God.”  
Some say Jesus never declared Himself to be God, but that is not true.

His enemies were well aware of Jesus’ claim to deity.

**John 5:18 NKJV**

<sup>18</sup> Therefore the Jews sought all the more to kill Him, because He not only broke the Sabbath, but also said that God was His Father, making Himself equal with God.

**John 10:30–33 NKJV**

<sup>30</sup> I and *My* Father are one.”

<sup>31</sup> Then the Jews took up stones again to stone Him.

<sup>32</sup> Jesus answered them, “Many good works I have shown you from My Father. For which of those works do you stone Me?”

<sup>33</sup> The Jews answered Him, saying, “For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy, and because You, being a Man, make Yourself God.”

**Matthew 26:63–64 NKJV**

<sup>63</sup> But Jesus kept silent. And the high priest answered and said to Him, “I put You under oath by the living God: Tell us if You are the Christ, the Son of God!”

<sup>64</sup> Jesus said to him, “*It is as you said. Nevertheless, I say to you, hereafter you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven.*”

<sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.

**Colossians 1:16 NKJV**

<sup>16</sup> For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him.

<sup>27</sup> For the Son of Man will come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and then He will reward each according to his works.

**Acts 10:42 NKJV**

<sup>42</sup> And He commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that it is He who was ordained by God *to be* Judge of the living and the dead.

<sup>3</sup> And at once some of the scribes said within themselves, “This Man blasphemes!”

<sup>4</sup> But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, “Why do you think evil in your hearts?”

<sup>5</sup> For which is easier, to say, ‘*Your* sins are forgiven you,’ or to say, ‘Arise and walk’?

<sup>6</sup> But that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins”—then He said to the paralytic, “Arise, take up your bed, and go to your house.”

<sup>7</sup> And he arose and departed to his house.

<sup>48</sup> Nathanael said to Him, “How do You know me?” Jesus answered and said to him, “Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you.”

**Luke 8:22-25 NKJV**

<sup>22</sup> Now it happened, on a certain day, that He got into a boat with His disciples. And He said to them, “Let us cross over to the other side of the lake.” And they launched out.

<sup>23</sup> But as they sailed He fell asleep. And a windstorm came down on the lake, and they were filling *with water*, and were in jeopardy.

<sup>24</sup> And they came to Him and awoke Him, saying, “Master, Master, we are perishing!” Then He arose and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water. And they ceased, and there was a calm.

<sup>25</sup> But He said to them, “Where is your faith?” And they were afraid, and marveled, saying to one another, “Who can this be? For He commands even the winds and water, and they obey Him!”

**Isaiah 7:14 NKJV**

<sup>14</sup> Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.

**Luke 1:26–35 NKJV**

<sup>26</sup> Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth,

<sup>27</sup> to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name *was* Mary.

<sup>28</sup> And having come in, the angel said to her, “Rejoice, highly favored *one*, the Lord *is* with you; blessed *are* you among women!”

<sup>29</sup> But when she saw *him*, she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was.

<sup>30</sup> Then the angel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.

<sup>31</sup> And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name JESUS.

<sup>32</sup> He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David.

<sup>33</sup> And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end.”

<sup>34</sup> Then Mary said to the angel, “How can this be, since I do not know a man?”

<sup>35</sup> And the angel answered and said to her, “*The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God.*

It is important to understand that Jesus is the promised Seed from Genesis 3:15

**Genesis 3:15 NKJV**

<sup>15</sup> And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel.”

**Galatians 3:19 NKJV**

<sup>19</sup> What purpose then *does* the law *serve*? It was added because of transgressions, till the Seed should come to whom the promise was made; *and it was* appointed through angels by the hand of a mediator.

<sup>13</sup> Now when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from Him until an opportune time.

**Hebrews 2:18 NKJV**

<sup>18</sup> For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, He is able to aid those who are tempted.

<sup>7</sup> For many deceivers have gone out into the world who do not confess Jesus Christ *as* coming in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.
