## BACH IN THE SUBWAYS CONCERT

(Oakwood, OH – March 4, 2024) Join us on Palm Sunday, March 24, at 12:15 p.m., at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, 33 W. Dixon Ave. in Oakwood, for a [Bach in the Subways](http://bachinthesubways.org) performance by St. Paul's music director, Cara Geerlings, on piano and pipe organ. The concert will feature the music of Johann Sebastian Bach, born March 21, 1685, and is part of an international effort to bring live classical music to the masses. The *Bach in the Subways* event has taken place annually between March 21 - 31 following its inception in 2010.
