FIRST READING: I SAMUEL 3:I-IO

ow the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. ne sabbath Jesus and his disciples were going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain.
