

Small Group Guide: Age of dCeption

Opening Prayer & Icebreaker

Icebreaker Question: Share about a time when you believed something that turned out not to be true. How did you discover the truth?

Key Scripture References

- Matthew 24:3-8, 24
- Genesis 3:1-6
- Isaiah 14:12-15
- John 8:44
- 1 John 4:1-3
- Galatians 5:16-26

Main Points Summary

1. Deception's Origin and Nature

- Satan has been using deception since the Garden of Eden
- Deception is the ability to make someone depart from the truth of God's Word
- It pleases the senses, involves pride, and works best in isolation

2. Jerusalem as the Epicenter

- All Bible prophecy points to Jerusalem
- Satan doesn't want God's chosen people in Israel
- We support God's chosen people and place, not necessarily political positions

3. Modern Tools of Deception

- Technology (social media, AI, cell phones) can be beneficial but also deceptive
- Immediate reactions and isolation increase vulnerability to deception
- The tools of deception are more sophisticated than ever before

4. Our Response

- Stay anchored in Scripture

- Test everything against God's Word
- Walk in the Spirit, not in fear
- Band together with other believers

Discussion Questions

Understanding Deception (15-20 minutes)

1. **How does the story of Eve's deception in Genesis 3 reveal Satan's tactics? What made the deception believable to her?**
2. **Pastor Jerry defined deception as "the ability to make someone depart from the truth of God's Word." In what ways do you see this happening in our current culture?**
3. **The sermon mentioned that "deception pleases the senses and enraptures the emotions." Can you think of examples where emotional appeals have been used to lead people away from biblical truth?**

Technology and Isolation (15-20 minutes)

4. **Discuss the statement: "If I were Satan, I would have invented a cell phone." What are the benefits and dangers of technology in our spiritual lives?**
5. **The Bereans "searched the scriptures daily" to verify what Paul taught (Acts 17:11). How can we apply this practice in an age of instant information and social media?**
6. **How does isolation make us more vulnerable to deception? What practical steps can we take to stay connected with other believers?**

Men's Responsibility (10-15 minutes)

7. **The sermon emphasized Adam's failure as the spiritual leader.** Men, how does this challenge you in your role? Women, how can you encourage the men in your life in this area?

Discerning the Times (15-20 minutes)

8. **Matthew 24:4 says, "Take heed that no one deceives you."** What are some current events or cultural trends that require us to be especially discerning?
9. **How can we distinguish between legitimate concerns about world events and being controlled by fear or anxiety?**
10. **The sermon stated that all Bible prophecy points to Jerusalem.** How does understanding this help us interpret current Middle East events?

Walking in Truth (15-20 minutes)

11. **Read Galatians 5:16-26.** How does walking in the Spirit protect us from deception? Which fruit of the Spirit do you most need to cultivate right now?
12. **What does it practically look like to "renew our mind" through Scripture in daily life?**

Daily Practice:

Technology Audit:

- ☐ Evaluate your screen time this week. Is technology serving you or controlling you?
- ☐ Before reacting to something you see online, pause and ask: "Is this true? Does it align with Scripture?"
- ☐ Commit to putting away devices during family meals or fellowship times

Community Connection:

- ☐ Reach out to another believer this week to discuss something you're processing or questioning
- ☐ Start or join a group that studies Scripture together (like the Bereans)

Men's Leadership:

- ☐ Men: Initiate a spiritual conversation or prayer time with your family this week
- ☐ Read one chapter of Proverbs each day (aligned with the day of the month)

Spiritual Discernment:

- ☐ When you hear news or information that creates strong emotions, write it down and compare it to Scripture before responding
- ☐ Memorize 1 John 4:1: "Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God"

Pray for:

- Wisdom and discernment in an age of deception
- Protection from isolation and the ability to stay connected with believers
- Men to step into their role as spiritual leaders
- A renewed hunger for God's Word
- Israel and Jerusalem
- Those who are deceived and don't yet know Christ
- The courage to speak truth in love
