Understanding Spiritual Gifts

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What stood out to you most from the sermon? Why?
- 2. The pastor mentioned two extreme views on spiritual gifts: *cessationism* and *sensationalism*. Have you encountered either of these views? How do you think we can maintain a balanced approach?
- 3. How does the idea that spiritual gifts are meant to unify the church body challenge or encourage you?
- 4. The sermon emphasized that spiritual gifts should always point to Jesus. Can you think of examples where you've seen gifts used appropriately or inappropriately in this regard?
- 5. Which of the spiritual gifts mentioned (wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discernment, tongues, interpretation) intrigues you most? Why?
- 6. How can we cultivate an environment in our church where people feel free to use their spiritual gifts without falling into division or competition?
- 7. The pastor said, "Nothing the Spirit does will cause division." How can we apply this principle when we encounter disagreements about spiritual gifts in the church?

Practical Applications:

- 1. This week, reflect on how God might be gifting you to serve the church. Pray for discernment and openness to His will.
- 2. Practice extending grace to fellow believers who may have different views or experiences with spiritual gifts than you do.
- 3. Look for opportunities to encourage others in their spiritual gifts, focusing on how their gifts edify the body and glorify Christ.
- 4. Study the passages mentioned in the sermon (Romans 12:6-8, Ephesians 4:11, 1 Peter 4:9-11) for a more comprehensive understanding of spiritual gifts.
- 5. If you're uncertain about spiritual gifts, commit to learning more through prayer, study, and conversations with mature believers.
