

The Lord is my Salvation!

“Behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid; for the Lord God is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation.” With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. And you will say in that day: “Give thanks to the Lord, call upon his name, make known his deeds among the peoples, proclaim that his name is exalted. “Sing praises to the Lord, for he has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth. Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.”

When Isaiah declared, “God is my salvation,” he wasn’t just saying that God provides salvation.

He was saying that salvation is a person — and His name is Jesus.

Do you know Him?

The Hebrew word for salvation used here is “Yeshua,” which literally means

salvation, deliverance, rescue, health and welfare.

It’s the same root from which we get the name Jesus (Yeshua – “The Lord saves”).

“She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.”

So when we say “The Lord is my salvation,” we are declaring:

“The Lord Jesus Himself is my savior, my deliverer, my healer, my rescuer, my redeemer, my righteousness, my peace, He is my all in all.”

“I love you, O Lord, my strength. The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. I call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies.”

The word saved here is the Greek word *sōzō*

Transliteration: *sōzō*

Pronunciation: sode'-zo

Outline of Biblical Usage:

- 1 to save, keep safe and sound, to rescue from danger or destruction
- 1 one (from injury or peril)
- 1 to save a suffering one (from perishing), i.e. one suffering from disease, to make well, heal, restore to health
- 2 to preserve one who is in danger of destruction, to save or rescue
- 2 to save in the technical biblical sense
- 1 negatively
- 1 to deliver from the penalties of the Messianic judgment
- 2 to save from the evils which obstruct the reception of the Messianic deliverance

KJV Translation Count: 110x

The KJV translates Strong's G4982 in the following manner: save (93x), make whole (9x), heal (3x), be whole (2x), miscellaneous (3x).

Strong's Definitions: ἰσώζω sōzō, sode'-zo; from a primary σως sōs (contraction for obsolete σάος sāos, "safe"); to save, i.e. deliver or protect (literally or figuratively):—heal, preserve, save (self), do well, be (make) whole.
