The Incomprehensibility of God Definition

- Incomprehensibility
- comprehend at all.
- Does not mean God is unknowable

• Does not mean we are referring to something we are unable to

• Does mean that none of us can comprehend God exhaustively

The Incomprehensibility of God

- that we, the finite, cannot grasp the infinite
- know about God

• The idea of Incomprehensibility of God comes from the basic tenet

The Incomprehensibility of God A balance between two errors

- know Him completely

• The first is thinking that since God is incomprehensible, He must be utterly unknowable, and anything we say about God is conjecture.

God but we bear His image and therefore, God can reveal himself to us, not in His language but in ours. He can communicate to us in a manner that we can understand, not exhaustively, but truly


The Incomprehensibility of God What does this mean for us?

The Eternity of God Definition

- Eternity of God refers to His existence backward through time far as we can imagine and beyond.
- God never had a beginning and will never have an ending
- time when He ceases to be.

The Eternity of God Definition continued
