Positionally - Christians at justification have been "set apart" (made Holy) to be God's own possession. You have been declared to be holy positionally in Christ. Practically - Christians are still a mess and need to be increasingly "set apart" (made holy) from sinful actions and relations to live out their positional holiness.

Work "for" assumes that salvation is a goal or reward for which you are laboring or striving.

Work "out" assumes that salvation is already in place; salvation has already been accomplished and experienced and you are now unpacking it, exploring it, laboring so that it might experience it in its fullness.

How does God do His work?
