“Woe To You”

37% of pastors have a biblical worldview

- ***Senior Pastors: 41%***
- ***Associate Pastors: 28%***
- ***Teaching Pastors: 13%***
- ***Children's and Youth Pastors: 12%***
- ***Executive Pastors: 4%***
- ***Most Americans (68%) consider themselves Christians, only 6% have a biblical worldview.***

In this context, it is easy to see Jesus simplifying and saying, "Forget about all those other yokes. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me."
