1. The Serpent's Deceptive Scheme:

Satan plants seeds of doubt about God and His goodness.

(v.1-5)

"There was a real serpent, as there was a real paradise; there was a real Adam and Eve, who stood at the head of our race, and they really sinned, and our race is really fallen.

Believe this."

Satan's attacks here had 2 Purposes:

- 1. To lead Eve to doubt God's Word.
- 2. To lead Eve to doubt the goodness of God.

What Adam was told by God:

"And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

Genesis 2:16-17

What Eve tells the serpent:

"We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.'" Genesis 3:2-3



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2. The Seduction of Temptation:

Eve sins by allowing the tempter's words to sway her away from God. (v.6)

3 Insights about the fall of mankind and the power of sin

"Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does He Himself tempt anyone. But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed. Then, when desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, brings forth death." James 1:13-15

The Pattern of Temptation: You see it, You want it, You take it, and You hide it.



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2. The Seduction of Temptation:

Eve sins by <u>allowing</u> the tempter's words to <u>sway her away from God</u>.

(v.6)

3. The Separation Experienced:

Adam and Eve's sin brings shame and the loss of innocence. (v.7-8)
