







Abraham had been tested a number of ways:

- The Forsaking Test, when leaving Ur of the Chaldees to come to Canaan.
- The Famine Test, after arriving in Canaan.
- The Falsehood Test, in Egypt when he lied about Sarah.
- The Family Test, in regards to parting with Lot.
- The Fortune Test, in turning down the reward offer from the wicked king of Sodom.
- The Foremost Test, when he is asked to offer up his son, Isaac.
