(v.14-19)

God's curse applied to the serpent. (v.14-15)

God's curse applied to the woman. (v.16)

God's curse applied to the man. (v.17-19)



## The curse of death shows that the result of Adam's sin extended to the entire human race. Because of Adam:

- Sin entered the world (Romans 5:12)
- Death came to all mankind (Romans 5:15)
- Death reigned over man and creation (Romans 5:17)
- All men were condemned (Romans 5:18)
- All men were made sinners (Romans 5:19)
