

Sermon Discussion Questions
Psalm 66 | How Awesome Are Your Deeds

1. **Opening Question:** If you could instantly relive one moment from your past—a vacation, accomplishment, family memory, or milestone—which would you choose and why?
2. **Read** Psalm 66.
3. Psalm 66 points to both the Exodus and the crossing of the Jordan into the Promised Land. How did this expand or deepen your understanding of salvation? What does it mean that salvation is not only what we've been saved *from*, but also what we've been saved *to*?
4. The psalmist praises God not only for salvation but also for trials. What emotions or hesitations does that raise in you? Have you ever been able to thank God for a difficult season? Why or why not?
5. According to Deuteronomy 8, God uses trials to humble us, reveal our hearts, and ultimately do us good. How have you seen those purposes in your own life?
6. The sermon suggested that trials often reveal what is already in our hearts rather than creating something new. Have you experienced a trial that exposed an area where you needed to grow—or perhaps revealed a faith that God had been cultivating without you realizing it?
7. The sermon emphasized that a testimony is personal and specific. Can you identify one concrete way God has delivered you from a particular sin, sustained you through a trial, or given you hope for the future that you could share with someone else this week?
8. The conclusion presented Jesus as the greater Moses, the one who accomplishes the greater Exodus, endures the ultimate trial, and even testifies on behalf of his people before the Father. Which of those three truths is most encouraging to you right now, and why?
