

Small Group Questions — Genesis 13:1–18

1. Read Genesis 13:1–4. What do Abram's actions after leaving Egypt reveal about his relationship with God?
2. Read Genesis 3:8–13 and Genesis 13:3–4. How do Adam and Eve's response to sin and Abram's response after failure differ?
3. Read 2 Corinthians 7:10. What is the difference between godly sorrow and worldly sorrow? What might each look like in everyday life?
4. Read Romans 2:4. How does God's kindness lead us toward repentance rather than away from Him?
5. Read Genesis 13:5–9. What do you notice about the way Abram handles conflict with Lot? What could he have done differently?
6. Read Genesis 13:8–11. What does Abram's willingness to let Lot choose first reveal about trust, fear, and control?
7. Read John 15:4–5. What is the difference between trying harder to produce spiritual fruit and abiding in Christ?

8. Read Genesis 13:10–14. What contrast do you see between Lot lifting up his eyes and God telling Abram to lift up his eyes?

9. Read Genesis 13:14–18. What does God promise Abram after he releases control? How does trusting God affect the way we hold our possessions, plans, relationships, or reputation?

10. Read Philippians 2:5–8 and 2 Corinthians 5:21. How does Jesus' willingness to give Himself for us shape the way we respond to failure and the way we live with open hands?
